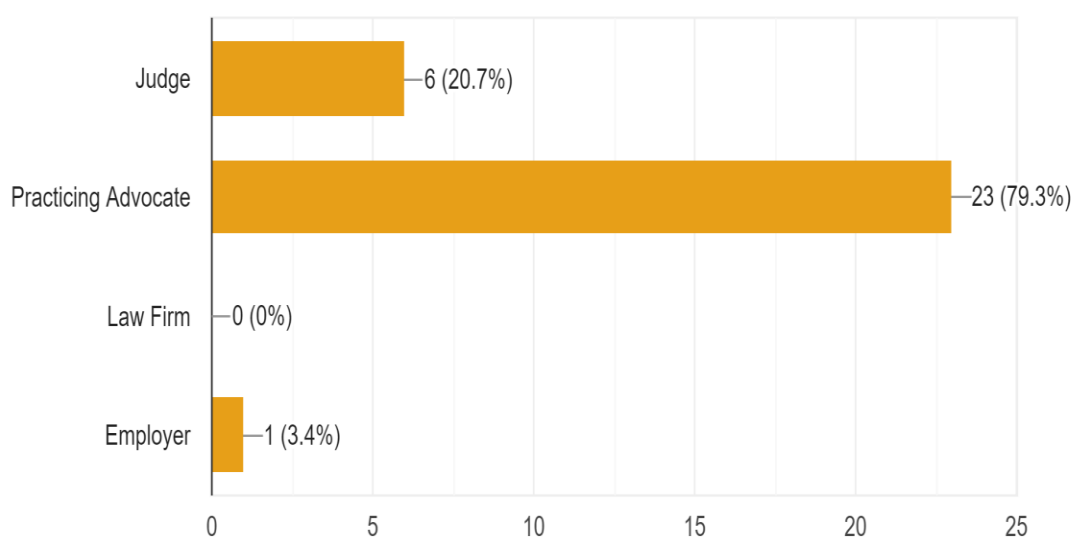


Employer Feedback on Curriculum (2020-2021)

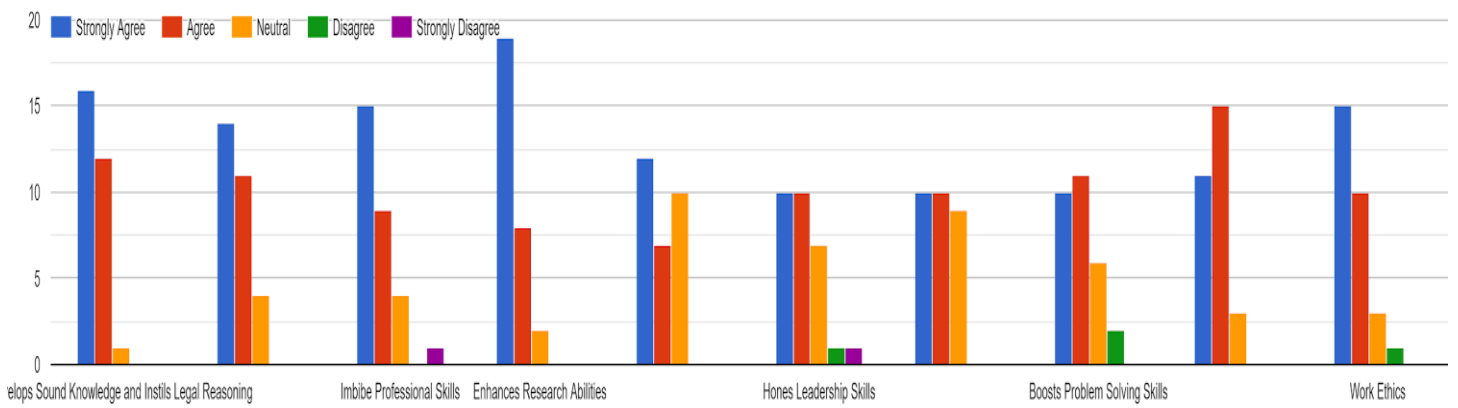


Criteria on which feedback on Law Curriculum is based:

10. Work Ethics

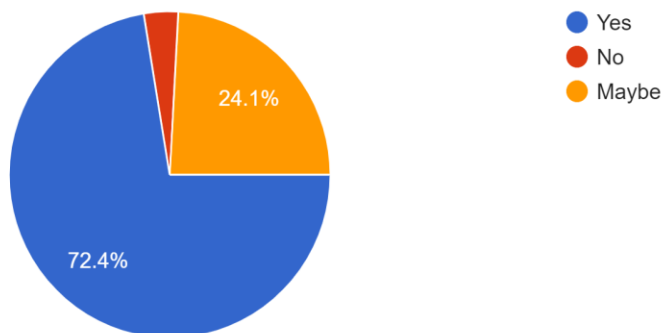
Chart of Analysis Feedback on Law Curriculum

Suggestions for Curriculum Improvement

- Begin internship from the second semester itself and expose students to the real world. Let them join NGO, police station and observe records and other sections instead of only focusing on internship under a lawyer.
- Some good ethics to be suggested

- Inclusion of Goa specific laws especially Portuguese Civil Code and Inventory Laws.
- Practical based work
- Mooting should not be optional. Also, drafting should probably get some more attention than it does right now.
- More focus on drafting and research methodology. Basic acquaintance with locations of all Courts, Tribunals, Cells, Forums and Commissions.
- More practical problem solving on all subjects.
- Focus should be more on practical rather than theory
- More practical components and students should be encouraged from 2nd year to join internships
- Need to improve on social consciousness and imbibe more ethical practices.
- Focus on building confidence among law graduates.
- Focus on helping litigants in free legal aid matters
- Above topics could be introduced.

- Patterns of internal assignment should make students more involved with the society to understand the importance of law and their responsibility as budding advocates a legal aid programme should be encouraged to assist people not only by making them aware but assisting the common people in a way students can.
- Considering the competition out, practical knowledge should be given more weight.
- Introduce Practicals for Degree (Three Years) course like in the 5 year course.

Suggestions on the most important skill that the college must concentrate upon for immediate action?

- Imbibe practical knowledge in students. Let them be bold and be aware of basic details. Let them explore. Use legal aid and help the public with basic forms and information. Students cannot do this alone. Let the professors follow up.
