## **COMPULSORY MOOT COURT REPORT 2023-2024**

### **FACULTY CO-ORDINATORS**

Key aspects of Conducting Compulsory Moot court

- **Understanding of Legal Process:** Students have a decent hold over the legal process, i.e. right from case analysis and argument preparation to courtroom decorum. Also, it helps them to practically understand how legal principles are applied in real-life situations.
- **Research and Case Analysis:** Through extensive legal research and case analysis, students learn the importance of thorough preparation. It teaches them how to solve complex legal issues, identify relevant precedents, and craft compelling arguments based on precedent and statute.
- **Oral Advocacy Skills:** Moot Court focuses on sharpening the oral advocacy skills of the students and also develops their ability to express their arguments convincingly and to synchronize their arguments. To adapt on the spot to the unexpectedly challenging opponent's argument and respond to the judges more skilfully.
- **Professionalism and Courtroom Etiquette:** The courtroom experience reinforces the importance of professionalism and courtroom etiquette. Students gain a first-hand understanding of the decorum expected of legal practitioners and the need for respectful interaction with judges and opposing counsel.

Thus, compulsory moot court lay a solid foundation for our students in the future as legal professionals. The compulsory moot court has undoubtedly been a transformative experience, providing students with practical skills and knowledge that will be invaluable as they embark on their legal careers.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

#### ➤ OVERVIEW OF THE MOOT COURT PROBLEM AND LEGAL ISSUES

For two days of Compulsory moot court sessions, five problems were selected, and the allotment of these problems was according to their old roll numbers. Out of five moot court problems, two problems were based on the Constitution of India, one on consumer law and the remaining two on the Indian Penal Code, Indian Evidence Act, and Information Technology Act.

Moot Problem No.1: -

Point of Determination: Challenged constitutionality of Section 15 of the JJ Act, 2015, with respect to Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India Act. Sections 29,30,42,42A of the POSCO Act, 2012, with respect to Articles 14 and 21 of the constitution of India.

Moot Problem No:2: -

The problem revolved around a deficiency in services that were provided to the client and also to prove if she was a consumer as per the Consumer Protection Act.

Moot Problem No:3: -

The problem is based on theft in the Vigilance Department and the authenticity of departmental enquiry. And also to ensure that a Statement of Accomplice is to be relied upon or not.

Moot Problem No:4:-

Students were asked to prove the innocence of the accused in the act of abetment to suicide. And emphases were on the last-seen theory.

Moot Problem No: 5

In this Problem, an Unregistered association had filed a writ petition against the head of the state and its officer for performing religious functions in her official capacity.

### PREPARATORY PHASE

- Drafting of Moot Problem  
Dr. B.S. Patil and Dr. M.R.K Prasad were in charge of scrutinising the problem. Changes were suggested to get the problem in a suitable ambit. Problem consisted of a two to three-page, briefing about the facts at the start and later concluded with the point of determination. Students were then allotted this problem as per their roll numbers. A total of five problems were selected for compulsory moot courts.

## SECOND COMPULSORY MOOT COURT REPORT HELD ON 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> March 2024

### ➤ OVERVIEW OF THE MOOT COURT PROBLEM AND LEGAL ISSUES

Six problems were selected for two days of Compulsory moot court sessions, and the problems were allotted according to their old roll numbers. One problem is based on the Constitution of India, one on consumer law, and the remaining three on the Indian Penal Code, Indian Evidence Act, Information Technology Act, and one on Goa Succession Act.

Moot Problem No.1: -

The appeal is preferred against the National Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission in the matter of medical negligence, before the Supreme Court.

Moot Problem No:2: -

The plaintiff is asked to prove himself as one of the co-owners who has challenged the Deed of Sale executed by the Defendant of the undivided property.

Moot Problem No:3: -

The problem is based on sections 300 and 299 of the IPC. The accused is required to prove his innocence under sections 96 and 97 of the IPC.

Moot Problem No 4:-

Point of Determination: The petitioner challenged the constitutionality of a State order banning internet access under Articles 19(1)(a), 19(1)(g), and 19(2) of the Constitution of India Act.

Moot Problem No: 5

In this problem, it is for the Accused to prove her innocence u/s 300 of IPC and if she is liable only for causing grievous hurt.

Moot Problem No: 6

Students were asked to prove the innocence of the accused in the act of Kidnapping. And to prove the legality of Marriage as per Muslim law.

## PREPARATORY PHASE

- Drafting of Moot Problem  
Dr B.S. Patil and Dr M.R.K Prasad were in charge of scrutinising the problem. Changes were suggested to solve it suitably. The problem consisted of a two—to three-page briefing about the facts at the start and later concluded with the point of determination. Students were then allotted this problem as per their roll numbers. A total of six problems were selected for compulsory moot courts.
